B. Results of χ^2 tests for goodness of fit, comparing aspects of Club membership with population data (see Results).

Comparing age composition of the membership with that of the population of FNQ at large: 1932–39 membership compared with 1933 census data – Chi-squared = 99.29, critical value at p=0.05 is 12.59, null hypothesis (i.e. no difference in age composition) rejected. 1946–50 membership compared with 1947 census data – Chi-squared = 44.00, critical value at p=0.05 is 12.59, null hypothesis rejected.

Comparing composition of Committee 1932–1950 to that of general membership, by occupations: Chi-squared = 274.85, critical value at p = 0.05 is 16.92, null hypothesis (i.e. no difference in composition) rejected.

Comparing composition of membership by sex with that of the populations of FNQ, Greater Cairns and Committee: critical value at p = 0.05 is 3.84

FNQ Region: 1932–39 membership compared with 1933 census data – Chi-squared = 25.25, null hypothesis (i.e. no difference in sex composition) rejected; 1946–50 membership compared with 1947 census data – Chi-squared = 2.26, null hypothesis accepted (no difference).

Greater Cairns: 1932–1939 membership compared with 1933 census data – Chi-squared = 29.81, null hypothesis (i.e. no difference in sex composition) rejected; 1946–1950 membership compared with 1947 census data – Chi-squared = 0.8, null hypothesis accepted (no difference).

Committee 1932–1950: – Chi-squared = 0.27 (with Yates continuity correction), null hypothesis (i.e. no difference in composition) accepted.
